3 ditahan seludup petrol bersubsidi, 2 lori dirampas

Kota Kinabalu: Tiga individu termasuk seorang remaja lelaki warga Indonesia ditahan selepas didapati terbabit dalam aktiviti menyeludup petrol bersubsidi di sebuah stesen minyak di Batu 32, Sandakan, kelmarin.

Semua suspek ditahan dalam operasi oleh sepasukan anggota Tiger Platon Batalion 15 Pasukan Gerakan Am (PGA) dan anggota Task Force Perisikan Batalion 15 PGA Sandakan kira-kira jam 130 pagi

dakan kira-kira jam 1.30 pagi. Komander Briged PGA Sabah, Senior Asisten Komisioner Abdul Rani Alias berkata, bertindak atas 'maklumat awam, pasukan operasi mengesan kegiatan pengisian petrol bersubsidi secara tidak sah.

Katanya, anggota kemudian membuat pemerhatian selama 30 minit di stesen minyak berkenaan sebelum menahan tiga lelaki berusia 19 hingga 36 tahun membabitkan dua warga tempatan dan seorang warga Indonesia.

"Pasukan operasi merampas dua lori bersama 58 tong biru membabitkan 4,400 liter petrol dengan rampasan dianggarkan sebanyak RM109,020," katanya.

Three nabbed for smuggling subsidised petrol in Sandakan

KOTA KINABALU: Three people were arrested for trying to smuggle subsidised petrol from Sandakan. The suspects, aged between 19 and 36, were nabbed in a sting

operation by the police General Operation Force (GOF) at a fuel station at 1.30am on Tuesday. Personnel from the Sandakan GOF Tiger Platoon and Intelligence Task Force had staked out the station following a public tip-off about the illegal purchase of subsidised netrol. petrol.

Sabah GOF Brigade commander Senior Asst Comm (SAC) Abdul Ráni Alias said the station had been under surveillance for 30 minutes before they moved in to arrest the

suspects.
"The team seized two lorries, which we believe were used to transport the subsidised fuel that

was bought illegally," he said in a statement on Wednesday.

He said they also seized 58 oil drums containing 4,400 litres of petrol.

"We estimate the seized items to be worth RM109,020," he said, adding that the case is being investigated under the Control of

Supplies Act 1961.

SAC Abdul Rani said the suspects were brought to the Sandakan police station for interrogation.

They were later handed over to the Descriptor Trade and Course.



MyCC board to get chicken cartel report by month's end

KUALA LUMPUR: A report on alleged cartels controlling the price and production of chicken will be presented to the Malaysia Competition Commission (MyCC) board on June 27, says its chief executive officer Iskandar Ismail.

He said the board headed by chairman Datuk Seri Mohd

He said the board headed by chairman Datuk Seri Mohd Hishamudin Md Yunus would then decide if the investigation found any infringement.

"A decision will then be made with our proposed next steps including notifying the parties involved and inviting them to give their defence before we come to a final decision.

"Following the final decision, we can then fully reveal our findings to the public," he said, adding this was expected to be sometime in

September.

"As of now however, investigations are still being actively carried out," he told reporters after MyCC's public consultation on amendments to the Competition Act 2010 (Act 712) here yesterday.

Under the Competition Act 2010, a cartel is defined as being formed through a secret agreement between competitors in the same market.

These competitors agree to either fix the price of their products, divide their markets or limit production, among others.

On Feb 1, MyCC announced it had set up a special task force to investigate allegations of anti-competitive conduct which included anti-competitive agreements and/or abuse of dominant positions in the market that could cause an increase in the price of goods.

This came following a directive from the National Action Council on the Cost of Living meeting chaired by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob.

Deputy Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister Datuk Rosol Wathid had also said MyCC was in the final stages of completing its investigation, with the findings expected to be tabled this month.

Commenting on MyCC's public consultation process, Iskandar said it was encouraging to see so many stakeholders from both government and industry.

"This is promising when we consider that public consultation is still something relatively new in Malaysia," he said, adding that many also posed high quality questions during the session.

In his speech earlier, Domestic Trade: and Consumer Affairs Ministry secretary-general Azman Mohd Yusof said the public consultation provided fresh perspectives on improving the Competition Act.

He added that the sessions were also important to obtain input fromvarious stakeholders.

"The input will then be compiled and shortlisted for discussion by the ministry before being brought to the Cabinet."

"This will then be brought to Parliament, hopefully by the end of this year," he said.
